Hanging of the Greens

The Hanging of the Greens service is a service you will not want to miss! On Wednesday, December 4, at 6 p.m. in the Sanctuary we will all learn again the reason for the many Christian symbols we use in

our Christmas decorations. It is a cheerfully chaotic moment when we deck the halls of our homes, and it is no less so in God's Sanctuary. Our children will all be asked to help decorate the Chrismon Tree, families

will process in with wreaths, evergreen garlands, candles, and more, and you will hear the story of the ornamentation that brings light to this sacred time.

The First Sunday in Advent, December 1, begins our liturgical, yearlong journey through the life of Christ. As we begin the Christian year, we also celebrate the Holy Season known as Advent. It is a time when we prepare ourselves for the coming of our Messiah. Advent means "Coming." We celebrate these days of Advent in expectation and preparation for Christ's arrival.

Through the centuries, Christians have observed a time of waiting and expectation before celebrating the birth of the Savior at Christmas.

The Advent season is a time for reflection and preparation, but its mood is joyful. This season makes innkeepers out of all of us, asking each of us to make room for the arrival of Christ the King. One of the many ways we celebrate His coming is to ready our hearts and lives by making ready our homes and our sanctuary!

The Hanging of the Greens Service began in Europe. Originally, live greens were used just prior to Christmas and kept throughout the final days of Advent and the 13 days of the Christmas Season with proper care. Evergreens used at Christmas were first understood as a symbol of the Eternal One coming to dwell among us as Word made flesh. They also were a sign of life and growth overcoming and flourishing amid the dead of winter, and so symbolized the resurrection of Christ.

Most churches now, like ours, hang the greens closer to or even just before the beginning of Advent for use throughout the Advent and Christmas Season. When hung for Advent, the symbolism of evergreens points to the unending life of the age to come when Christ returns, and our own everlasting life as the new creation of Christ. Come, join us as we continue this ancient tradition of preparing our hearts and walls for the coming of the Newborn King!
