Day 1:

Day 2:

Planted by Living Waters

DevotionalImagine a tree planted by a stream, its roots constantly nourished by fresh water, producing fruit in season and maintaining green leaves even in drought. This is God's picture of a person who stays connected to His Word. Just as a tree needs consistent water to thrive, we need regular nourishment from Scripture to grow spiritually. When we remain connected to this divine source, we don't just survive - we thrive. Our lives bear fruit naturally, not through striving, but through staying connected to the source of life.

Bible Verse

They are like trees planted by streams of water which yield their fruit in its season. And their leaves do not wither. In all they do, they prosper. - Psalm 1:3

Reflection Question

What practical steps can you take to ensure you're consistently 'planted' near the living waters of God's Word?

Day 3:

Bible Verse

No good tree bears bad fruit, Jesus said. Nor again does a bad tree bear good fruit. For each tree is known by its fruit. - Luke 6:43-44
