

- The Lamb of God; Revelation 5

Summary

This sermon explores Revelation 5, focusing on the paradoxical image of the victorious Lion of Judah appearing as a slaughtered Lamb. The pastor explains how this imagery challenges worldly concepts of power and victory, revealing that God's true power is demonstrated through sacrifice, humility, and compassion rather than force or control. The passage culminates in a universal worship scene where all creation acknowledges the worthiness of the Lamb, pointing to the ultimate destiny of creation - the worship of God.

Devotionals

Day 1: The Unexpected King

Devotional When we think of power and victory, our minds often drift to images of strength, dominance, and control. We envision mighty lions, powerful rulers, and unstoppable forces. Yet, in God's kingdom, true power takes an unexpected form. The Book of Revelation presents us with a startling image: the victorious king appears not as a conquering lion, but as a slaughtered lamb. This profound imagery challenges our worldly understanding of power and success. Instead of force and might, God's power is revealed through sacrifice and selfless love. This radical shift in perspective invites us to reconsider what true strength looks like in our own lives. Perhaps the moments when we feel weakest - when we're serving others, showing compassion, or sacrificing our own desires - are when we're most aligned with God's definition of power.

Bible Verse Then I saw between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders a Lamb standing as if it had been slaughtered, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth. - Revelation 5:6

Reflection Question How might your perspective on strength and power change if you viewed them through the lens of sacrifice and service rather than control and dominance?

Quote For in one of the most arresting images of Scripture, what comes forward to open the scroll? Who will be the revelation to us as the great victor? It is the Agnus dei, the slaughtered lamb, the lamb of God standing as if it has been slaughtered.

Prayer Lord, help me understand Your definition of power. Transform my heart to value sacrifice and service above control and dominance. Guide me to find strength in humility and victory in love. Amen.

Day 2: The Power of Humility

Devotional In a world that celebrates self-promotion and personal achievement, God's kingdom operates on a completely different value system. The divine economy turns our earthly understanding upside down. Those who are truly great in God's eyes are not the

wealthy, the powerful, or those with the most control. Instead, God elevates the humble, the compassionate, and those who give sacrificially of themselves for others. This isn't just a nice theological concept - it's a call to action. When we choose to serve others, when we put their needs before our own, when we respond with gentleness instead of force, we're not showing weakness. Rather, we're demonstrating the kind of strength that God values most. Today, consider how you might practice this kind of humble strength in your relationships and daily interactions.

Bible Verse

He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly. - Luke 1:52

Reflection Question

In what specific ways can you practice humility and self-giving love in your relationships today?

Quote God makes worthy the meek and the mild, the compassionate, the humble, the self giving, the sacrificial disciple who acts out of love rather than selfishness.

Prayer

Heavenly Father, grant me the courage to be humble. Help me to see opportunities to serve others and give of myself sacrificially. May my life reflect Your values rather than the world's. Amen.

[Day 3: Suffering with Purpose](#)

Devotional Following Christ doesn't guarantee a life free from hardship. In fact, the early Christians faced intense persecution for their faith. Yet, their suffering had purpose and meaning when viewed through the lens of Christ's own sacrifice. When we face trials and difficulties, we're not alone - we're following in the footsteps of our Savior who chose to suffer for our sake. This doesn't make the pain easier, but it gives it meaning and purpose. Our struggles can become opportunities to demonstrate Christ-like love and resilience. When we respond to hardship with grace and continue to serve others despite our own pain, we participate in the kind of victory that Christ achieved on the cross.

Bible Verse

And I saw that between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders stood a Lamb as if it had been slaughtered. - Revelation 5:6

Reflection Question

How can viewing your current struggles through the lens of Christ's sacrificial love change your perspective on them?

Quote Just because you might be in faith in Christ doesn't mean you are exempt from all the world's sufferings. You will face trials, you will face sufferings.

Prayer

Lord Jesus, when I face trials, help me remember Your example. Give me strength to respond with love and grace, knowing that my suffering can have purpose and meaning in Your kingdom. Amen.

Day 4: Love That Transforms

Devotional The power of God's kingdom isn't found in controlling others or forcing submission. Instead, it's revealed through acts of compassion that draw people into relationship with Him. This transformative love was demonstrated perfectly in Christ, who ruled not through force or manipulation, but through self-giving love. When we choose to act with compassion, when we reach out to those in need, when we love those who are difficult to love, we're participating in this kingdom work. Our acts of love and kindness, no matter how small they might seem, can be powerful instruments of God's transforming grace in the world.

Bible Verse

He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. - Luke 1:51

Reflection Question

What opportunities do you have today to demonstrate God's transformative love to others?

Quote God did not spare his own son, but gave him up for the salvation of us all. And he rules not by an example of force or manipulation, but he rules by acts of compassion that call us into his love and to love him in return.

Prayer

Gracious God, fill me with Your compassion for others. Help me to be an instrument of Your transforming love in the world. Use my actions to draw others into Your kingdom. Amen.

Day 5: Our Ultimate Destiny

Devotional All of history is moving toward a magnificent conclusion - a grand worship service where every tribe, nation, and tongue will gather to glorify God. This ultimate destiny gives purpose and direction to our lives today. When we worship, we're practicing for eternity. When we serve others in love, we're participating in the kind of activity that will characterize heaven. This future reality should shape how we live in the present. Our acts of compassion, our humble service, our sacrificial love - all of these are preparing us for our eternal destiny of glorifying God. Today, let every act of service be an act of worship, every moment of compassion a preview of heaven.

Bible Verse

Then I looked, and I heard the voice of many angels surrounding the throne and the living creatures and the elders; they numbered myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands.

Reflection Question

How might viewing your daily activities as preparation for eternal worship change the way you approach them?

Quote Our destiny, the whole creation's destiny, is a worship service that glorifies God.

Prayer
