A SERVICE OF LESSONS & CAROLS: 144 YEARS OF TRADITION

n 1880, E.W. Benson the Bishop of Truro, later the Archbishop of Canterbury, designed a service of lessons and carols to draw people out of the common houses, or bars, and into the Cathedral on Christmas Eve.

Benson's service was structured around nine scriptures and reflective carols detailing the Fall of Humanity, the prophecy of the Messiah, the Incarnation, and the Great Commission. Although many British churches adapted his work, it was not until 1918 when Eric Milner-White, the Dean of King's College in Cambridge, established a tradition of inviting the townspeople to join the students on Christmas Eve for a Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols

As an act of Christian outreach this invitation seems less than unique, but it served a greater purpose among the decimated student body in the wake of the First World War, which concluded a month earlier. Milner-White set his service apart from others by including what he called a Bidding Prayer, in which he invited those present to meditate upon the Good News and "to go even unto Bethlehem." His prayer has seen additions and adjustments through the years, but his focus upon the poor, hungry, and oppressed remains unwavering.

In 1928, King's College agreed to televise their service for the first time, and this exposure influenced churches, colleges and universities, and communities across the globe to host their own festivals. It is with the joyful weight of this tradition that our worship arts ensembles will come

together with guest musicians from the Tallahassee Symphony Orchestra to present our Third Annual Service of Lessons and Carols. It is with great pleasure that we invite one and all to join us on the journey to Bethlehem.

Excerpt of Bidding Prayer by E.W. Benson

Beloved in Christ, be it this Christmastide our care and delight to hear again the message of the angels, and in heart and mind to go even unto Bethlehem and see this thing, which is come to pass, and the Babe lying in a manger... let us pray for the needs of the whole world; for peace on earth and goodwill among all his people; for unity and brotherhood within the Church he came to build, and especially in this our diocese ... let us remember, in his name, the poor and helpless, the cold, the hungry, and the oppressed; the sick and them that mourn, the lonely and the unloved, the aged and the little children; all those who know not the Lord Jesus, or who love him not, or who by sin have grieved his heart of love... all those who rejoice with us, but upon another shore, and in a greater light, that multitude which no man can number, whose hope was in the Word made flesh, and with whom in the Lord Jesus we are one forevermore.


